





TALERIE IOSUE GREW UP in Northeast Philadelphia and attended Catholic School for all twelve years of her adolescent education. Eventually graduating in 1999 from Saint Hubert's High School, Valerie was passionate about dancing from the time she was two years old. She was a naturally talented and gifted dancer, so it was much to her family's surprise when at sixteen years old, Valerie decided she was going to start kickboxing. "My family was pretty surprised. They thought I was going to try out for the Pennsylvania Ballet and here I was switching to kickboxing." she laughs. "I actually bartered with a local gym, where I would work the front desk in exchange for free kickboxing classes." Just like ballet and kickboxing, the juxtaposition of Valarie's personality runs deeply in all parts of her character. She is kind but tough. Delicate and tenacious. Gorgeous yet hard working and extremely down to earth.

This local gym where Valerie spent a majority of her time was also where the universe would have bigger plans than just kickboxing, and Valerie would meet her late husband. A fifteenyear-old Valerie would meet a then 18-year-old Mark while working and kickboxing. "I remember he walked in and I thought, 'Whoa,' he just totally caught my eye. The owners of the gym told me not to even think about it, which made me like him more," she laughs. The two ended up spending a lot of time together for a few years. "Mark actually started working at the gym and we would kickbox together and just hang out together all the time."

When Valerie was twenty one years old, she made the decision

to move to Virginia to avoid an increasingly difficult situation at home, "I knew I needed to seperate myself from the situation, so I moved to Richmond, Virginia with my aunt." She enrolled into Virginia Commonwealth University for criminal justice, where she later received her bachelor of science degree and administration of justice from Penn State several years later. While in Virginia she also enrolled into the police academy. Valerie was in the police academy for an incredibly intense nine months before graduating and becoming a police officer. "When I graduated from the academy, I was really proud of myself because it was the hardest thing I had ever done up to that point. I woke up at 5 am everyday and wanted to quit. My entire mindset was changed for the rest of my life after that."

During Valerie's journey in Virginia, she had lost touch with Mark. As distance tends to do, and Valerie's intense training at the academy, the two hadn't spoken or seen each other since she had left. Eventually, she returned to the area and was able to reconnect with Mark through the beauty of social media. "I was just laying in bed one night, and there was Mark on Facebook," Valerie explains. The couple reconnected, got married and began their life together.

During their marriage, Mark suffered from acid reflux for many years, assuming it was just something that was just a "part of his life." The doctors weren't worried when he began complaining about acid reflux and heartburn. Instead, they prescribed antacids, as they often do with people who suffer from acid reflux. Mark followed their medical advice and continued with his life with Valerie and their four children. "He just kind of thought that was

something he had to deal with," Valerie said. "The doctor never mentioned that that could lead to a serious condition."

It wasn't until Mark began to experience unbearable and extreme chest pain that he finally went to the doctor to get checked out. It was then the endoscopy was recommended.

But before the endoscopy could even take place, Valerie had to rush Mark to the emergency room because of the extreme pain and the fact that he had lost 20 pounds in two weeks. After a CAT scan, the doctors discovered that Mark was riddled with cancer that started in his esophagus and was now in his stomach, liver, and lymph nodes. Diagnosed with stage four esophageal cancer, Mark immediately began treatment, and it changed Valerie's life instantly.

"Most people don't know that acid reflux can lead to esophageal cancer," Valerie said. "So what they recommend, if you look up the facts about it, is if you have chronic acid reflux more than a couple of days a week for four to six weeks, you should go talk to your doctor." Valerie became Mark's caretaker while he went through brutal chemotherapy treatments and immunotherapy. "With immunotherapy, it either works really well, or it doesn't work at all," Valerie said. "Unfortuantely,

it just was not working for him.

Tragically, Mark passed away after a nine-month battle at a hospice in 2019. This was the beginning of Valerie's journey of awareness, advocacy, and addressing grief and trauma. A young widow with four children, Valerie knew that she needed to focus on the healing process, so she turned to do what she has always loved: dancing. She went to her children's dance teacher, Sandra Fortuna, who has a background in ballet, and asked if she could dance for her. "Look, I have not danced in 21 years," Iosue said. "But I need to dance because I need to keep moving. I feel like this is the only way I can grieve is to express myself through dance." Sandra and Valerie put together a choreographed dance, and she performed it twice. Valerie also had her kids in it because the dance was about her husband and their marriage. It was designed as a cathartic piece.

Unfortunately, Iosue's misfortune didn't end there, though. In March of 2021, she was diagnosed with stage two breast cancer. After finding a lump on her breast, her doctor sent her for a mammogram and biopsy. After she lived through her husband's illness, Valerie knew she needed to be on top of it and was going in with a fighter's stance. She was going to be her strongest and best advocate. Because of what she experienced with her husband's illness, she insisted the doctors order her an MRI, which ultimately showed that she had breast cancer. Valerie also had genetic testing done and learned that she has an ATM gene mutation, which causes many cancers.

As of right now, insurance doesn't cover mammograms if you're under 40 unless there is a problem and a doctor orders one, something that Valerie would like to see changed. Valerie believes having the age lowered to thirty is paramount for women because having one in her thirties saved her



life. "If I had a mammogram when I was 40, I might not even be alive," Iosue said. "Who knows how far it would have spread."

Valerie also had to undergo a double mastectomy and reconstruction at the same time. "When they said the word mastectomy to me, I thought I was gonna pass out," Iosue said. "I didn't even know reconstruction was an option." Twenty-four rounds of radiation she also had her fallopian tubes and ovaries removed. Because her type of cancer was essentially fueled by estrogen, removing those organs is the best way to keep her cancer-free.

At each round of radiation, she would bring props such as a Wonder Woman costume, and at her last treatment, instead of ringing a bell, which most cancer patients do, she wore brilliantly colored butterfly wings. She tried to keep her spirits up because, to her, her mindset was the key to healing. "I know for a fact that my mindset is what got me through that," Iosue said. "At a certain point when you've gone through trauma or immense grieving, you have a choice. You have a choice to bring joy back into your life. You can revisit the grief whenever you need to. You can cry and be sad on days that you need to. But it's okay, to be okay. It is okay to keep going and find joy again. Grief and joy can coexist in your life."

Iosue has a podcast called "Dancing in the Rain with Valarie," spreading awareness and providing education about breast cancer. She stresses the importance of self-breast exams and genetic testing. She also talks about trauma and grief and how she addressed those issues in her life, hoping to help and inspire others.

"The grief never leaves; it's always there for the rest of your life," Iosue said. "You're a different person, but it doesn't have to define you for the rest of your life."

I say go for it. Give it your all, but most importantly, be happy, stay in the moment, and believe in yourself and your ability to have everything you want in life.


Do you or did you have a woman leader or mentor inspire you to be your own boss?

WAYNE PEIFFER, Teacher at Tatem

Why did you become a teacher?

I have always felt a calling and a natural interest in working with young people. In my teenage years, I started working with children through camps, community organizations, and church events. During these early experiences I learned about the power of personal relationships. I've always enjoyed leading a group or team to a common goal, so teaching was a natural fit with my personality and skill set. My great grandmother was a teacher in Collingswood well before I was born, and my mother served as an academic support and SEL teacher. These

influences and heritage also primed me for a career in teaching. The call to teach was further confirmed throughout my undergraduate studies and student teaching experiences.

What is your teaching philosophy?

My teaching philosophy is centered on individual relationships with students. I believe relationships are more important than teacher practice and carefully crafted lessons. There's an age old saying that "students aren't interested in what their teacher knows until they KNOW that their teacher cares about them." While I do not believe that the teacher "knows all." I do agree that students are motivated and more primed for learning when they feel safe, heard, and valued by their teacher. Emotional and relational investments into the lives of my students produce more social and academic growth than cuttingedge teaching strategies, fancy charts, or detailed lesson plans. Other teaching philosophy mantras I love are "Growth over Grades," and "No Perfect People Allowed." The first relates to the importance and power of developing a growth mindset. The second indicates that all people in the classroom (teachers, assistants, students, etc.) are just that; people. Nobody is perfect and it's okay to make mistakes. In fact, we MUST make mistakes in order to learn and grow.

What is your biggest strength as a teacher?

One of my biggest strengths is the ability to build relationships with

What is your favorite subject?

Math, because it is easy for me to learn. Mr. Peiffer always talks about how math is full of cousins. Like addition and subtraction are similar but not the same like a family.

What do you feel is the most important part in being a good member of your school community?

Making sure that everyone is having fun, focusing, and they are

doing the right things. In this school, there's no bullying or being mean to each other because we know what to do and are kind. I do like ¾ of that.

What is the most difficult part in being a student today?

Covid, because if our friends have Covid we can't see them. I can speak from experience because when I had Covid I couldn't see anyone. And you can't go to school. Remote learning was hard because of the fact that your teacher isn't there to tell you what to do, and when you're so used to it, your brain would be wondering why your teacher isn't there. Teachers have a great personality and make students want to do the work. Like



students in order to engage, motivate, and encourage them on their learning journey. I love infusing creativity, movement, song, and anything wacky into lessons as a way of engaging students. In addition to personal relationships, I value culture building with my class as a whole. I love helping my class create and maintain a classroom culture that causes students to feel appreciated for who they are today and empowered to grow into the person they want to become tomorrow.

What's your favorite part about teaching at Tatem?

My favorite part about teaching is the community we have built together. This

community includes the students, staff, parents, and community members working together to promote learning, connection, curiosity, and social emotional growth. This community supports one another throughout all seasons of life. This community rallies around families in need.

Favorite hobbies and interests?

My favorite activity outside of school is spending time with my family. My wife and I are blessed with a 3-year-old son and a 1-year-old daughter. Besides family time I love hiking, running, music, and most of all BASKETBALL!

Why did you select the student?

I selected Pierce because of his growth both personally, socially, and academically throughout 4th grade. Getting back into a more normal routine for school this year wasn't easy. Transitioning to full days, larger class sizes, new teachers, and countless Covid procedures were just some of the difficult parts to starting 4th grade. Despite these challenges, Pierce has worked hard to maintain positive relationships with peers; something that's not easy for kids who have been separated for a long time. Pierce has shown immense improvement in managing his emotions especially during the uncertainty and stress of the pandemic. Pierce is also empathetic towards his peers, and he's usually there with a smile, a high 5, or a word of encouragement.

Mr. Peiffer is super funny. Mrs. Nixon is super kind. Mrs. Dezii always stopped to help you if she thought you needed help.

What are your thoughts on Mr. Peiffer?

If there's ever a question, he is a good listener and tries whatever he can to get you on task. He also runs flag football for us and he is a really good coach. Sometimes we ask for a play and sometimes he lets us just "go for it."
